Hello NEAANA. I'm an addict named Mike. it's an ongoing privilege to serve this area and Narcotics Anonymous. The RSC was held January 28th & 29th in Dothan, AL, it was quiet eventful to say the least. We started off Saturday morning with an Outreach S/C meeting, the RD stated he would like for Outreach to do a workshop at the next SEZF in July. We moved on into the Admin meeting and there was discussion about the minutes and why some get the minutes and why some don't. We don't have a Regional Secretary so I ask who is responsible for the minutes, the Vice Chair said it was his responsibility but he's not secretary material and can't do it, he also said if that's a problem we can remove him. Michelle is currently the Policy Chair and has agreed to take on the responsibility. The Policy Chair will go over the policy proposals at the next RSC. The RD gave a workshop on Public Relations, there was some good information even though our Region is going back to Public Information. The nomination for Chris A as FITS alt treasure passed. That concluded the first day of the RSC. On Sunday morning the RCMs met for the roundtable discussion but due to the FITS Chair and the Surrender Chair not being present the first day they gave their reports that took up most of the roundtable time, especially the FITS Chair who seemed to be trying to politic as to why FITS should get the \$2000 increase, I brought it to his attention that we had already voted on the issue and he should move on, he came back with he had heard there was a block so he wanted to explain why this money was so important, another RCM interrupted and told him again this issue has already went to the groups and we have the votes and we really need to move on, but the FITS Chair still continued promoting FITS. Finally we were able to move on into the discussions and votes as this is what the roundtable is for, our area was the only area blocking the \$2000 increase and it was determined the block was invalid and I don't think anyone is surprised. I was reminded when there's a block we need to send an alternative solution. I did let the RSC know we were pretty sure they would rule the block invalid and pass the proposal. The next item was the purchasing of the Adobe Key, there was a lot of discussion on this issue and I let the RSC know that area was prepared to block at our ASC when Harold H (RD) called me and ask if we would hold off on the block and that we would be able to use the SEZF key for awhile, so we finally decided to table this until the next RSC. The acting Secretary was going over the proposals as we were getting ready to close and she claimed the purchase of the Adobe Key had passed, and I interrupted to let her know she was incorrect and it did not pass after some heated discussion it was determined by the Chair and Vice Chair that it did not pass and was tabled until the next RSC. Needless to say this issue would've been pushed through if I had not been paying attention. It is very clear some members of the RSC want this Adobe meeting to continue and think it's in our best interest to purchase the key even though it's been proven ineffective time after time, it keeps coming up about how much money the Region will save by purchasing the key, and the justification is that FITS and

Surrender can use this tool and eliminate some of the face to face meetings that these conventions have therefore eliminating travel and hotel expenses. The next RSC is May 6th & 7th in Birmingham and this will be my last RSC as RCM. We still don't have a RCM-A. I've wondered about whether this area being a part of the ALNWFL Region benefits us in anyway, the only thing that comes to mind is having a voice when it comes to World issues such as the CAR and CAT. I'm not asking that we leave the Region but I would like some feedback from the groups. I'm asking this area to reimburse me for the difference in funds I received for the hotel which was \$200 and the actual hotel bill was \$212.44 and also my gas expenses which was \$63.00 for a total of \$75.44, I have receipts. The inventory we requested was blocked by 2 Areas because there's no estimation of the Cast. The Outreach Chair is working on this and w. II have info at next RSC.

It helps focus our efforts each cycle and frames the projects presented to the WSC for approval. In our continuing effort to refine and improve our planning process, we've created an opportunity for delegates to provide input upfront, directly influencing the plan by providing data we can consider as part of our environmental scan.

As you know, the foundation of our strategic plan comes from an environmental scan. This scan reflects our best efforts to capture trends and issuesboth within and outside of the Fellowship—that affect NA. The information about the Fellowship in past scans has come from our interactions at zonal forums and workshops, contact with service committees and members, our participation in professional events. and various other NAWS activities.

One of the World Board's responsibilities is to listen closely to the Fellowship and let what we hear and observe impact our planning process. Delegates and others have asked for a way to directly share their perspectives and experiences, and we believe this opportunity for delegates and regions to input the environmental scan is one step in creating this improvement. This is the first time we have tried a forum like this to collaborate with regions in the planning process, so it may be a learning experience for us all. At the next WSC, we can talk together about what we think worked well in this new collaborative approach and what needs to be improved.

We typically spend portions of three World Board meetings to create our plan. Simplistically, our

first meeting reviews and discusses the environmental scan and begins to outline possible priorities. Our second meeting gets much more detailed about what those priorities might mean in our Fellowship and service system, and the third meeting defines the approaches we believe we can accomplish in one cycle and begins to create the project plans to present to the WSC. In order to make this work, we communicate between meetings to keep the process moving forward. We have adjusted the timeline for planning this cycle in order to provide enough time for your participation. We expect there will be more

adjustments needed in the future after we have all gained additional experience.

Please respond to this survey by 30 April 2017. This should allow sufficient time for most regions to have met. We will then compile the responses and include them in our environmental scan data. Our planning sessions will

take place at our July, October, and December 2017 meetings. This is a little later than is typical for us, but we believe the outcome will be worth the delay.

We ask that delegates submit the input so that we can have some way to evaluate and weigh the possible 118 responses. We expect that the way delegates gather this input will vary as widely as the comments we typically receive in regional reports. That varies from input from the delegate, to collecting individual members' input and submitting a collective response, to workshopping at the regional meeting.

This is not meant to be a scientific survey. The questions here are only seeking the delegates and/or the regions' perception of these issues. Thank you for helping us take this step forward.

Public Information Subcommittee

February 12, 2017

Hello Family,

The subcommittee this month did do a flyer day for the Breaking the Chains group in Pell City. We had a lot of support and were able to distribute the 250 flyers to the local businesses.

The following is a list of the dates and contacts I have made over the last month.

St. Clair County - Harvey Bell Executive Director of St. Clair County Court Referral on January 24th. He did take my name and number and said he would call me back. I did not hear back from him, so I contacted him again on February 7th and there was no answer and no voicemail option at that time. I was sent a list of numbers to contact for St. Clair County, one of which was Mr. Bell, and the other was for Family Court. I called the family court number also on February 7th and the number just rang, and there was no voicemail.

<u>Jackson County</u> – On January 26th, I spoke to Cia at Jackson County Court Referral and she thought a presentation would be great, but would have to run it by her boss. I have not heard back from her, but I know she has my number, as she gave it to one of her clients to contact me about starting a new meeting in Henegar. More will be revealed about that later.

On January 24th I spoke to Mark Boyanton at Scottsboro Family Life, and he advised me that the Sherriff's department wants to get meeting going in the Jackson County jail, and gave me their names and numbers. I did contact Rocky Harnett on 1/24 and 2/7 and 2/9. The first time we spoke he did advise me that their primary concern was security and making sure the people going in had enough clean time. He said they had an issue with that with the last group they let go into the jail. I assured him we have guidelines in place that would ensure the people bringing in meetings would have adequate clean time. He said he would talk to the Sherriff, Chuck Phillips and get me a date for a presentation. That has been pushed back, due to a recent shooting.

I know there are several folks eager to get a meeting going into the Jackson County Jail, and I want them to know that we are working on it and that things often happen in HP's time, not ours.

I did get a call from the woman in Henegar who wants to start a meeting there. I share some of my ESH with her about that location, and told her where there are some other meetings around that area that she might try to attend, and that if she wanted to start a

meeting the best thing she could do was attend our ASC. At this time I have not heard back from her.

Per a request from the Chair, I did also contact Donna Blackburn down at Inspire, to see if they had any formal guidelines for volunteers coming into their facility. We did receive some information before about this, but it geared more towards the patients rules upon entering the facility. She did get back with me and stated that they do not have anything written down, and their only concern was having recent clients coming back into the facility too soon after leaving there.

PHONELINE- The phone line took 18 calls this month, for a total of 64 minutes. Our bill was 28.35 and was paid on 1/21/17. For primary this month we have Stephanie L for females, and Norm for males. They are moving up from secondary, so we will need two volunteers for secondary for phone line.






